Queen Anne Condos Open House A Huge Success

Saturday, August 12, 2006 proved to your correspondent, and possibly to the rest of the world, that the Queen Anne Grizzlies have the finest school spirit. On a bright morning the Queen Anne Condominiums, converted from the apartments into which the former high school had been altered in the mid-1980s, were the scene of a "love-in" by more than 1,000 alums of the school.

The opening ceremonies were preceded by a tour of the building for a group of volunteers from the Queen Anne Alumni Association and Board. Along with the alums were history teacher **Ed Billodue** and his wife. The official opening was to take place at 11 a.m. Mr. Billodue was to be a featured speaker at the opening. Unfortunately, he was not to be found when the program started. Our ever-resourceful association president, **Barb Nelson '58**, stepped to the microphone and called out, "Will Mr. Billodue please report to the principal's office." Sure enough, he dutifully appeared and gave a wonderful talk on what Queen Anne meant to him and to the thousands who went there. Following the speeches there was to be a ribbon cutting ceremony opening the building.

Let the words of **Don Estep '46** tell what happened next: "On the dot of eleven, over 300 people listened to opening remarks and viewed the four-inch wide maroon grograin ribbon which stretched all across the front porch. The head officer of the condo group came forward with a very large pair of shears about three feet long. He

spoke: 'At this time we dedicate this historic building as the Queen Anne High School Condominiums.' He then closed the huge blades on the maroon ribbon – unfortunately, nothing happened. He repeated himself and tried again – nothing happened. By the fourth or fifth time he was rather frustrated and the spectators were getting antsy. I pulled my little Swiss Army knife on my key ring out of my pocket, opened the little scissors on it and handed them to the official – three snips and the ribbon was cut!


1980s

A Twist on a 1960s Racial Incident: A letter from a '72 Alum


I appreciate your updates on the Queen Anne area. Queen Anne hill holds a lot of memories for me, starting from the political and social unrest due to bussing and desegregation issues of the '60s, to having some great friends in the area. When I think about QAHS and activities, student body and culture, I realize that not every day was a bed of roses. Most important is how those stories ended. I was one of several Afro-American students bussed in the early sixties to the Queen Anne school system, starting with elementary. We were considered black students then, but whatever. So by the time I reached Queen Anne High, I was part of the family. In my mind we all felt like one big family and worked very hard to keep out the negative issues of the surrounding community.

We had an incident one year, perhaps 1969, that erupted into a major racial incident. A young, black female student was accused of brandishing a knife and assaulting a white female student. We may all remember that Seattle was like the outer limits. One couldn't get breaking news from California but if it happened in Seattle, the story circulated fast around town.

Very quickly, the Black Panthers from the Central District and the White Panthers from the Ballard area descended on QAHS to provide protection and support for their respective constituents. Being alerted to this, the student body president in collaboration with the faculty called an all-school assembly to sort out the details and find a resolution. The police were summoned to protect the perimeter of the school, but to my knowledge were not allowed on campus unless requested. The school made a formal warning to both militant groups that their presence would not be tolerated.

I was recruited by our black students' representative to assist in the discovery process. I remembered one afternoon at the bus stop at the gas station on the Avenue where we were circled by the White Panthers in what could have been a bad ending. There wasn't as much anger - it was more their goal to protect the honor of the white female student and give us a warning. Now here's the twist: ironically, in our interview with both students, we determined that the boy friend of the white student was attracted to the black student and they were planning a dating arrangement. The white female student admitted threatening the black student with a knife. Both apologized to each other and became good school buddies. I could almost hear the deafening group laughter coming from the entire student body and faculty.

I still laugh when I recall that incident. More important, I felt an incredible sense of belonging to a student family and that we took care of each other. We mobilized very fast to solve a problem that was threatening our friendships. It also reminded me of the title of a song, "That's What Love Will Make You Do".
