Our 31st annual scholarship competition resulted in 30 scholarship awards made possible by the exceptional generosity of classes, reunion groups, individual donations and the collective donations of many Queen Anne alumni. There were 74 applications received by the March 31st deadline. From these, 23 scholarships were awarded to high school seniors and seven to college students.

Those interested in competing for a 2014 award should download the NEW application from the QA website next fall and **take great care to follow the completion instructions.**

Do not use an obsolete application form.

High school applicants must submit official transcripts, signed by / from their school's registrar, which must contain their fall semester grades. Post high school applicants must submit their high school, community college and most recent college transcripts.

Anything less than an official, signed transcript will disqualify the applicant from competition!

1928-1962: Marion Kline '28; Doris (McClure) Linkletter '31; Helen (Solid) Strong '36; Gwendolyn (Jones) Whyte '46; David Ernst '49; Carolyn (Sherry) Lewan '53; and Sheila (Wilson) Murray '62, all now live in the Wesley Retirement Home in Des Moines. Helen called our president, Sherry, and suggested we might send a Grizzly alum to interview all of them.

1930s: In addition to the above, the Queen Anne Historical Society was in contact with a woman from Great Britain, Boo Powe, who was trying to trace family in the Seattle area. Her cousin was Jeanette (Featherstone) Langone '36, who is buried in Queen Anne's Mount Pleasant Cemetery. Jeanette was included in this year's walking tour of the cemetery on June 22. There were several Queen Anne grads included on that tour.

1940s: Del Loder '46 won the Willard Jue Award in April 2013 given by the Association of King County Historical Organizations (AKCHO). The award was presented to him at the annual meeting held in MOHAI's new home in the former Naval Armory building at the foot of Lake Union. He received the award for his programming and walking tours for the Queen Anne Historical Society. On receiving the award he noted that he had known Willard Jue from the world of scouting.

Life is Art - Ruth (Jahnke) Waters '51

Ruth (Jahnke) Waters was the editor of the "KUAY Weekly" on which we worked together when we were seniors in 1950 -51. Journalism teacher Mr. Ernest Charland sent dozens of students off to careers in writing, including Ruth who graduated from Stanford in 1955 with a journalism degree. Ruth and her twin sister Doris (Jahnke) Lander '51 were among the brightest of Queen Anne grads that year.

Ruth pursued a writing career for awhile, including teaching journalism, but along the way writing gave way to sculpting. Here, Ruth found a better outlet for her creativity working in hardwoods and later, bronze, marble and paints. Her interest in wood sculptures began, she noted, helping her parents restore fine furniture. She has gone on to exhibit in many U.S. cities as well as in China and Ireland.

In addition to creating art, she also had some notable experiences in distance running. She told me she had completed 16 marathons and was nationally ranked in her age-group at one time. Some chronic foot issues have slowed her these days.

Ruth is the Executive Director for this full-blown museum, which also provides studio space for 28 artists. It took three years to develop, build and house their permanent collection. An asset for the entire peninsula community.
